MyMedicare long audit activity – Increasing the uptake of MyMedicare patient registration in patients with complex health needs

What's involved

In February 2023 the Strengthening Medicare Taskforce released a report advocating for the implementation of Voluntary Patient Registration (VPR). Currently, patients in Australia can visit multiple GPs or clinics without formally registering with a specific practice.

While this flexibility offers choices, it can also result in fragmented care and inefficient resource allocation. By analysing the demographic and health profiles of their registered patients, practices can identify patients who could benefit from voluntary patient registration

Learning outcomes

1. Describe the benefits of MyMedicare for your patients and the practice.
2. Review practice data to better identify suitable patient cohorts who would benefit from registering for MyMedicare.
3. Implement strategies to increase awareness and participation rates in MyMedicare for patients with complex health needs.

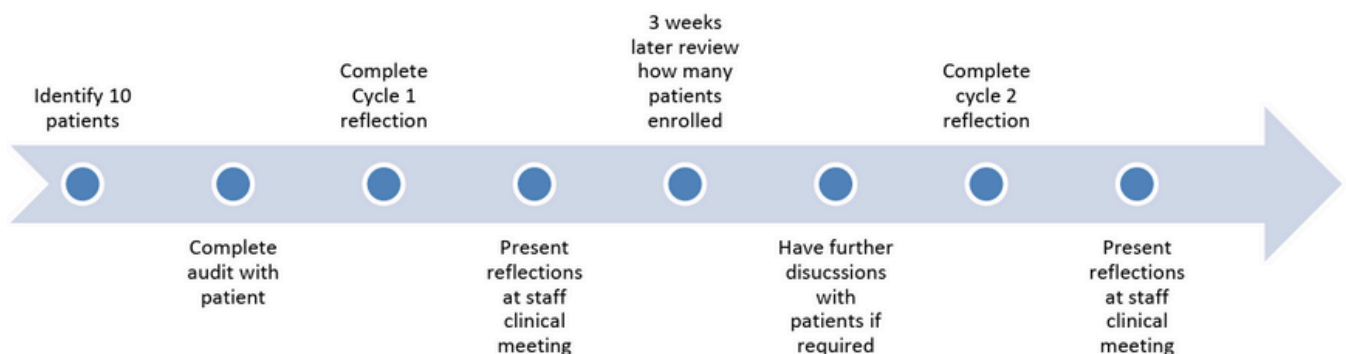
